

**Message from the Minister of Interior of Hungary
on the occasion of the 25th IBSSA Congress,
held on 6 June 2026 in Budapest**

Distinguished President,
Distinguished Guests,
Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is a great honor for me to extend my greetings to you on the occasion of the 25th Congress of the International Bodyguard and Security Services Association (IBSSA), which brings together distinguished representatives of the international security profession.
